Garden waste from over 350 trees is converted into compost through NADEP and vermi-composting, fostering sustainable agriculture and engaging students in environmental awareness.

The college promotes paperless communication through electronic displays and smartphone usage, minimizing paper consumption. Plastic use is discouraged, and the institution collaborates with local municipalities for regular collection of non-biodegradable waste.

Liquid waste management focuses on resource optimization. RO purifier wastewater is repurposed for sanitation and gardening,

while toilet wastewater is channeled into a septic tank. Additionally, defective items are recycled, emphasizing resource conservation.
